## Introducing Tesfaye

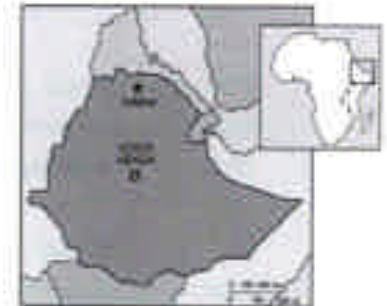


Birth date: 12 February 98

Tesfaye lives with his parents in Ethiopia. He has the opportunity to attend a local school and sponsorship will help him continue to receive an education.

Like children everywhere Tesfaye loves to play when he has the chance and his favourite pastime is football. Tesfaye also has to help out at home where his special job is looking after the animals.

Ethiopia is a beautiful and historic country in "The Horn" of East Africa. It is mountainous with a mixed population of Muslims and Ethiopian Orthodox Christians. 85% of its population are subsistence farmers, growing cereals and pulses or keeping sheep, goats and cattle. Coffee is grown for export. Low world prices and recurrent droughts have contributed to Ethiopia remaining one of the poorest countries in the world, which is prone to famine and food shortages.



- population: 69 million
- life expectancy: 45.5 (UK 78.1)
- 171 per 1,000 children die before their fifth birthday
- 58.5% of adults are unable to read or write
- 76% of the population do not have access to safe clean water
- 4.4% of the adult population are infected with HIV/AIDS
